## STUDENT MANAGEMENT COLLEGE CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

Students and other members of the Salesian College community are entitled to feel happy, confident and secure, and to believe that they are important and valued members of that community. All students of Salesian College are positively encouraged to live up to the following expectations and accompanying responsibilities and to make them their own, not simply for their personal self-discipline and development, but for the welfare of their educators and fellow students and the continued betterment of the good name of their College.

### Expectations and Responsibilities

Co-operate with their teachers in their efforts to guide and educate, and support their fellow students in their efforts to learn and progress	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Behave in a way which allows teachers to teach fellow students to learn effectively</li> <li>▪ Work and study at school and at home to the best of their ability</li> <li>▪ Complete all class and homework</li> <li>▪ Participate in the entire school program</li> <li>▪ Be regular in their attendance at school, and be punctual for their lessons and commitments</li> </ul>
Act in a safe and sensible manner with consideration for others	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Avoid behaving in a bullying or a threatening manner towards any member of the school community</li> <li>▪ Refrain from bringing weapons or any other dangerous, offensive or objectionable materials to school</li> <li>▪ Avoid throwing missiles or using any other materials in a dangerous manner</li> </ul>
Obey all safety regulations which apply at school and on school activities, and whilst travelling on College and public transport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Line up in an orderly manner at the Canteen, bus stops and prior to entering learning areas</li> <li>▪ Remain within the school bounds</li> <li>▪ Comply with all safety regulations issued by Staff</li> </ul>

## CARE & DISCIPLINE

Boys learn best in an environment which is warm and supportive and where there are clear expectations about their behaviour.

Boys cannot be expected to guess how they are expected to behave. If they are to do well socially and academically, they need to know exactly what is expected of them.

We know boys grow intellectually, socially and emotionally in classrooms with teachers who set consistent limits, who teach self-discipline and, establish caring relationships that value the uniqueness of each student.

### Classroom Discipline Plan

For these reasons, Salesian College has crafted a Classroom Discipline Plan faithful to the vision of St. John Bosco and modelled on best current educational practice. The Classroom Discipline Plan applies to ordinary situations. More serious offences will receive appropriate consequences. **The Plan helps build a positive atmosphere in each class using:**

- Rules which are easy to understand
- A Merit System to affirm boys when they do things well
- A Caution System to help boys work well and realize that actions have consequences.

### Rules

The following rules are in effect every lesson, every class, every day. They will help to ensure that the classroom is a safe and orderly place in which teachers can teach and students can learn. **The Classroom Rules in effect at all times at Salesian College are:**

- Follow directions the first time
- Keep hands off people and their belongings
- Do not leave the room or seat without permission
- No swearing, teasing, bullying or yelling

- Bring all necessary learning materials to class
- Fully complete all class and homework tasks
- Full, neat and correct uniform
- No eating in the classroom or corridors.
- Merit System

### Consequences

Students who experience difficulty in meeting these expectations and responsibilities will be assisted to do so as a normal part of the College's pastoral care program. Through such means as interviews with students and/or parents/guardians, individual counselling at school or referral to professionals beyond the school, exclusion from class activities or school representation, detentions, deprivation of privileges and application of the [College's Anti-Bullying Policy](#), these students will be helped and encouraged to actively pursue these expectations and fulfil their responsibilities.

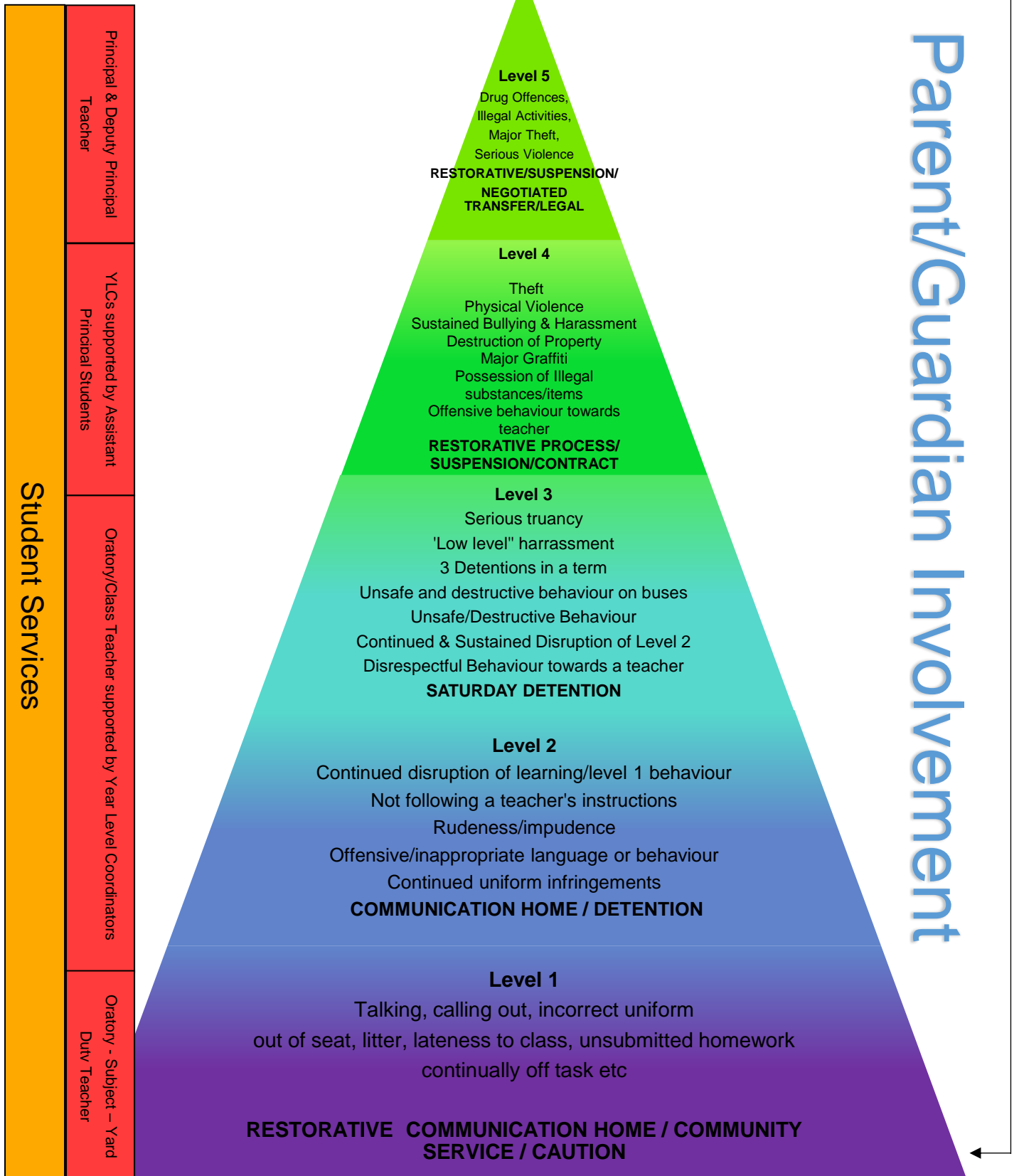
Those students who show a consistent unwillingness to live out these expectations and responsibilities will be suspended from regular school activities. Ultimately, if a student's behaviour is deliberately opposed to the College's expectations and the well-being of its community, expulsion – as a last resort – will be imposed by the Principal.

### Illegal Drugs

Students who deliberately disobey the College Code of Behaviour by introducing, using or trafficking **illegal drugs** on College premises may be **expelled** from the College. Expulsion will also occur when students introduce, use or traffick such drugs on school camps, retreats, excursions and other activities, or whilst wearing College uniform.

# BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT PYRAMID



1. **Community Service** will involve a student spending a part of their lunchtime or recess contributing in some way to the College Community e.g. tidying the yard or room.
2. **Restorative Processes** may involve a formal or informal conversation with the people involved in the incident to restore the relationship that has been hurt or damaged. It involves an apology and a commitment.
3. **Detention Sessions** will be held during the week from 3.20pm – 4.00pm. Saturday detentions will be from 9.00am-11.00am as required.
4. **Suspensions** are either “in-house” where the student is expected to come to school under the supervision of a Year Level Coordinator without any contact with others. “Out of school suspensions” are a very serious consequence that involves excluding the student from school until a meeting with the parents/guardians.
