


## Book Review of Entry Island by Peter May



This crime / historical fiction masterpiece is of a murder on Île d'entrée or as the book is titled, Entry Island.

The story beelines for the lead investigator Sime Mackenzie of the Montreal Police Force (yes, the story is based in Canada) and the wife of the murdered man Kirsty Cowell, and a whole host of suspects and weird and amazing character.
